Finally, if women spent the money and time these magazines cost to undertake more self-loving activities — studying new subjects, developing mental or physical fitness, setting goals and daring to achieve them — they would really build self-worth. Elizabeth Blackwell was born in England in 1821, and emigrated to New York City when she was ten years old. One day she decided that she wanted to become a doctor. That was nearly impossible for a woman in the middle of the nineteenth century. After writing many letters seeking admission to medical schools, she was finally accepted by a doctor in Philadelphia. So determined was she, that she taught school and gave music lessons to earn money for her tuition.

In 1849, after graduating from medical school, she decided to further her education in Paris. She wanted to be a surgeon, but a serious eye infection forced her to abandon the idea.

Upon returning to the United States, she found it difficult, as a woman, to start her own practice. By 1857, Elizabeth and her sister, also a doctor, along with another female doctor, managed to open a new hospital, the first one for women and children. Besides being the first female physician and founding her own hospital, she even established the first medical school for women.
