The symbol used, a cup of coffee, is a common object of everyday life, and therefore easily perceivable as a source for thinking about life. Elizabeth Blackwell was born in England in 1821, and emigrated to New York City when she was ten years old. One day she decided that she wanted to become a doctor.
